### COMMENTS OF THE ALLIANCE FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS INDUSTRY SOLUTIONS (ATIS)

ATIS submits these comments in response to the Commission's public notice issued In the Matter of Communications Assistance for Law Enforcement Act soliciting comments on the petition filed by the Cellular Telecommunications Industry Association (CTIA) regarding the suspension of the September 30, 2001 compliance date for the "punch list" and packet-mode communications capabilities required by the Third Report and Order in the same proceeding. Specifically, ATIS provides information regarding the recently held CALEA Legal Summit and the consensus of the industry members present at that Summit to support the CTIA petition for a suspension of the compliance date.

ATIS hosted the CALEA Legal Summit on September 14, 2000 in Washington, D.C. The Summit was organized<sup>1</sup> to provide a venue for the industry to identify and discuss the relevant issues and considerations with respect to the CALEA industry standards, from both a legal and engineering perspective, given the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia decision. Perhaps the strongest factor in planning the Summit was the fact that pivotal decisions regarding the disposition of J-STD-025 and its ANSI counterpart are scheduled to be discussed at the TR45.2 meeting in Seoul, Korea next week<sup>2</sup>. Many U.S companies with a stake in the outcome of those decisions

The LAES Ad Hoc Group exists as a subgroup to TR45.2 and includes participation from CTIA, ATIS/Committee T1, USTA and law enforcement representatives.

The plenary recommendations as recorded in the Draft Meeting Report of the LAES Ad Hoc are as follows: (1) J-STD-025 be forwarded to ANSI for publication; (2) ANSI publication of J-STD-025A be suspended; (3) notification of the U.S. Court of Appeals decision and a summary of how that decision affects the content of J-STD-025A be sent to all companies having a copy of the Interim Standard; and, (4) a project number be requested for work on a new revision of J-STD-025A to isolate the two capabilities [punch-list items] not vacated by the court decision.
